We have seen some significant changes in recent months with some key roles and people. Arthur Whillans has done a fantastic job in serving as our Centre Manager and Chaplain for the last 5 years and been involved with GMCC for many more years than that. - 1. **D** has grown greatly in his faith in recent weeks and is now being released. Pray for him as he begins his new life.
- 2. **M** has just moved to another prison. Pray that he will continue to grow as a Christian.
- 3. **A** is in prison for the first time and finding it hard to cope. Please pray that God would place the right people around him.
- 4. **D**'s sister has died and he is out next month and wants to go straight. Please pray that the unfortunate death of his sister would act as a catalyst for change.
- 5. J has been given a long sentence that he is finding hard to accept. Pray that with all the time he has that he would be searching for God.
- 6. **M**'s brother was seriously assaulted on the outside and is still in hospital. Please pray for healing for his brother and also for him to remain calm.
- 7. **M** has been hurt whilst in prison and it is his first time, he is also struggling with mental health issues. Please pray for the love of God to comfort him and also for healing and a sound mind.
- 8. **B** is mourning the loss of his mum and brother and cannot see much reason to keep on living. Please pray that he would understand that he has been fearfully and wonderfully made and that he was created for an amazing purpose.
- 9. **GMCC** hold a Bible group each Tuesday with City Centre Ministries. Please pray for God's presence and power as the group restarts after the holidays.
- 10. **P** is mourning the loss of his mum and is finding it hard to cope. Pray for comfort and peace.
- 11. J feels very isolated and is physically and mentally unwell. Pray that God would bring healing to his life, also that the right people would help bring him from isolation to being insulated with friends.
- 12. **L** is very anxious and longs to be closer to his family. Pray that he would be less anxious and that Christian family would surround him.
- 13. A comes across as very paranoid and suspicious. He needs help but is reluctant to accept it. Please pray that there would be an openness for him to get help.
- 14. J has just been released after serving his first sentence and says he is never going back. Please pray that he will make the right choices.
- 15. **A** that he is able to continue standing as a Christian on his wing and that he continues to be a strong role model.
- 16. **A** has been feeling very low as he doesn't like this season. Please pray that he settles down and makes it through the holiday period with no problem.

- 17. **G** has been struggling with paranoia and general side effects of smoking weed for years, please pray that the voices in his head would be gone and that he can have perfect peace.
- 18. **G** is in need of some good friends that will not take advantage of him, in prison and on the out.
- 19. J will be released after the New Year, please pray for divine appointments in housing and work sectors.
- 20. **F** is also going to be released sometime in the New Year, please pray that the correct housing can be found in an area that would suit him.
- 21. I has asked for GMCC to go and visit him, to look into different options before his release, please pray for wisdom and direction.
- 22. L has been in and out of prisons and homes most of his life, he puts on a show of no fear—but really he is scared of being on the streets again, please pray for the Holy Spirit to do a work in his life.
- 23. Please pray for all the prison staff and chaplains at this time as they deal with a multitude of different issues and behavioural problems.
- 24. Please pray for the men that our teams meet in prison through our regular Bible studies that they would receive Christ as their saviour.
- 25. **M** to become more consistent in his drug recovery process. He gets clean and does ok for a short while. Please pray that through Jesus he can find freedom.
- 26. **L** is trying to give up drugs and longs to live without them, please pray that he would have an encounter with God and that he would be delivered from addiction.
- 27. **N** has become regular in the Bible group and is hearing the gospel for the first time. Pray for his heart to be opened.
- 28. **P** has failed several times, even after being given help, due to his alcohol problem. Pray for real change and a new life.
- 29. **R** has been a great help but now faces a serious health issue. Please pray that he will be restored.
- 30. **W**, **A**, and **T** that they will remember the good times they had in the Bible group and all that they learned and that they will turn to the Lord.
