You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God, but let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about his being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to. ... Now it seems to me obvious that He was neither a lunatic nor a fiend: and consequently, however strange or terrifying or unlikely it may seem, I have to accept the view that He was and is God."

If we come to the same conclusion then we can enjoy Matthew and Luke's description of his nativity, John's proclamation that he was 'in the beginning' and Mark's statement that he is the Son of God. We are then in a position to face the momentous question of why. He is who he said he is and came from where he said he came so why not accept he came to do what he said he came to do? Just like there are many who want to water down the truth of who Jesus claimed to be there are sadly many who want to do the same with his purpose in coming. They are happy with descriptions of him as teacher, revealer of God's love, example or even healer but stop short of his own claim as having come to give his life as a ransom. He stood with sinners when he was baptized and in the place of sinners when he eventually died on the cross. As amazing as it sounds the truth is that the Son of God became the Son of Man that the sons of men might become the sons of God.

As we celebrate the fact that Jesus came down from heaven let us also pray that many of those who throughout the year have been involved with and either helped or been helped by GMCC will come to know who he is and what he has achieved.

PRISON PRAYER LETTER DECEMBER 2023

"I have come down from heaven" John 6:38

Who says things like this? Someone who also said he had the authority to forgive sins, that he always existed and was going to come back one day to Judge the world and even associated himself with the unique and special name of God expressed in the phrase "I am". It always puzzles me that some people say Jesus never claimed to be God. During one of his many conflicts with his Jewish opponents Jesus said "I and the Father are one". They prepared to stone him and he asked them why and they replied "We are not stoning you for any good work but for blasphemy, because you, a mere man, claim to be God." They were in no doubt about what he claimed.

C. S. Lewis was an Oxford medieval literature scholar, popular writer, Christian apologist and former atheist. He did not invent but made popular an argument based on these claims of Jesus in a series of BBC radio talks later published as the book 'Mere Christianity'. The argument has been summarised as Jesus being mad, bad or who he said he was. This is how Lewis put it:

"I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often

say about Him: 'I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God'. That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic — on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg — or else he would be the Devil of Hell.
