

## **PRISON PRAYER LETTER, FEBRUARY 2024**

In my last letter for this Newsletter I spoke about the Chaplaincy work which I do in HMP Manchester, (Strangeways); and the way I have had the pleasure of welcoming ex-offenders, and the newly-released, into our Cafe, here at the Methodist Central Hall in Manchester.

Our contacts, however, are not restricted to the Manchester Area, or even

to Manchester Prisons.

Matthew 25: 35-36, 40

For I was hungry and you gave me food, thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me. Then the righteous will say, "When did we do this?"

And the King will say in reply, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least I brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

We were approached recently by a gentleman whose son was in a prison in another part of the country but would be returning to the Manchester area on weekend-release, (prior to his actual release). At the request of this man we contacted his son and set up a correspondence with him:

the result being that when he was released for a period of time, and came up to Manchester to visit his Dad, we were able to welcome him into the Cafe, befriend him, exchange addresses and are now in contact with him in preparation for his impending release.

Another contact recently made by myself, (within the prison of Strangeways), is a man who is due to be released very shortly, and, again, I am able to re-assure him of the welcome, help and support that is awaiting him as soon as he leaves that place and shows up here at the Cafe.

Up to now most of our work has been with male persons, however, we are hoping to make and foster connections with female prisons in the area: thereby being able to offer the same welcoming facilities to women on their release. Up to now the only women we have helped have arrived here fortuitously, or are friends/family of male clients.

However, for the past year, we have held a Fortnightly Ladies Group, and included other ladies from the General Public who frequent the café. We have held sessions in Drama, Knitting, Painting, Craft, Beauty and Vocal Skills ,with always a drink and a chat.

- 10 Keep S in your prayers, who has been causing upset to others recently. May the Lord show him to love thy neighbour and return peace and harmony.
- 11 C is due at court this month, please pray for a favourable outcome.
- 12 Please keep J in your thoughts who is undergoing an operation today, pray for strength and healing.
- 13 Pray for the trustees of GMCC, may their faith enable them to guide GMCC.
- 14 A is waiting for a bed at a secure hospital, pray that the right space and treatment is made available to bring him back to health.

- 15 Keep L in your thoughts and prayers who has found out that his uncle has killed his grandad.
- 16 Keep P in your thoughts and prayers as he continues to write and share with our letter writing volunteer here at GMCC from prison.
- 17 Please offer hope for A who is due to be released in March and does not see any hope for the future.
- Thank the Lord that P has returned the GMCC, keep him safe and may he continue to come and share the word of the Lord.
- 19 Pray that R engages more during groups and sessions here at GMCC.
- 20 Pray for health and strength to P and his mum who has been diagnosed with breast cancer.
- E, our volunteer as she strives to increase the participants of a new group, pray that all can enjoy the benefits of community.
- M feels there is no point in living at the moment, pray for enlightenment and that he can find a sense of purpose with the help of our Lord.
- 23 Keep A and M in your thoughts, may they continue spreading the word of the Lord, and be blessed with good health.
- 24 Pray for healing and comfort for J, who has just be diagnosed with a serious illness.
- Thank the Lord for 20 years of GMCC and pray that our work continues for many more years to come
- A, a GMCC client who has been receiving help with applying for grants to aid mobility, pray that he is now more comfortable in his day to day life.
- 27 Pray for peace of mind and comfort for F who feels under threat here and that nowhere is safe.
